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- 5) The Agency agrees to continue to comply with the applicable provisions of the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 (the Act), Executive Order 12196, 29 CFR Part 1960, and the applicable safety and health standards promulgated pursuant to the Act.
- 6) The Agency also agrees to the following conditions:
 - It has abated all violations.

NOTICE TO EMPLOYEES

You or your representative also have the right to object to any of the abatement dates set for violations, which were not amended, provided that the objection is mailed to the office shown above within the 15-working-day period established by the original notice.
